Subject: Parking Discussion

Staff Contact: John Wells, Town Manager

Background: Town Council members have responded to a series of questions and provided direction previously on parking related issues in the Town. Attachment 1 summarizes the Council responses to the questions. Individual responses are included under Attachment 2. Based on the responses provided in the survey and the previous direction, it is Town staff's understanding that the direction of council can be summarized as follows:

Summary of Direction

1. **The Town will retain paid parking in its existing locations on the streets. The bags will be removed from the meters on Liberty and Harrison Streets, reinstating paid parking in those locations.** Based on previous analysis, it is cost prohibitive to use kiosks with credit card use due to the parking fee schedule, cost of processing credit cards, and the parking volume. It appears that the Council will want to address on street parking rates. This should be done prior to the upcoming budget process.
2. **The Town would no longer charge for parking in the Town Garage.** There would no longer be a need for the control gates, the collection booths or staffing related to the garage. **Staff would recommend that this direction be effective and reflected in the upcoming budget, effective July 1, 2015.** *This would allow for the financial impacts to be addressed as part of a comprehensive budget proposal. Staffing could also be addressed as part of the overall budget.*
3. **There would not be an expansion of permit parking zones or placement of meters in those neighborhoods (but allowing free parking to residents.)**
4. **Staff will continue to work with the County for better signage for the County Garage, the Pennington Parking Lot, and the Jail Lot, promoting free public parking nights and weekends.**
5. **Staff will bring an agenda item to a future worksession to specifically identify how the existing "P" (Parking) signs can be better defined and changed.**

Council should provide any clarifications if necessary at the Work Session.

If we had this and also the electric shuttle we may be able to leverage it to encourage the thousands of Outlet shoppers to shop/dine in DT, etc; (3) More safe bike access (more bike racks) - perhaps including the BikeShare program.

Also, during this discussion could Council get an update about the options for:

- "Curbside pick-up" in the Alley (e.g. has Scott or another staff member encouraged businesses to cooperate on this idea/may Council get an update please?) and/or Market Street for businesses on King Street (requiring an easement Stockman or the BB&T owner);
- and also the conversion of the police spot to a patron spot (e.g. Police foot patrols/bikes in DT?. Please refer to the email you sent on 2/6/14 at 2:56 PM. I realize there are security perceptions if this is eliminated but I think it's important that we discuss this and weigh the opportunity costs of not using it.

- a) Designate the Liberty lot as "Town employee only" - If there are more spots than we need, reserve the number that Jan Z. needs for his office building (which will include parking levels underneath the offices)
- b) Remove the extra ingress/egress lanes from the parking garage - They mostly just confuse people anyway
- c) Remove the parking booths in the parking garage - Make garage levels 1-n free (keep the basement leased)
- d) Replace the parking signs on the street to say (in big letters) "Free Public Parking" (with a big "P") and point them towards Pennington, Simones, the downtown garage, etc. Remove any signs that say "Town Parking Garage"

Parking Questions

Should there be paid parking on the streets? – Yes, absolutely.

Should the garage continue to charge for parking? – No.

Should the on street parking rates be equalized with the garage? – Definitely no, regardless of what the answer to the above question is. Street parking should be more expensive than garage parking. This encourages garage parking.

Should the town consider expanding the permit parking zones and place meters in those neighborhoods, allowing free parking to residents? – No. Let's not buy more meters.

Contingent Actions:

If the garage becomes free parking, all booths and gates will be removed.

If we continue to charge for the garage, staff will automate the garage and remove the booths but replace the equipment with the new system. – Let's discuss a "new system" before we decide on one. Not sure Council's expectations are aligned with staff. There are ways to eliminate all equipment leading into or out of the garage.

If we retain the charge for the meters, we will need to determine what type of meters can best be used due to the locations and costs of kiosks. – We have meters. Let's not overcomplicate anything.

Items being implemented by staff based on prior direction:

Better signage at the County garage for Free Public Parking Nights and Weekends.

Signage at the Jail Lot, the Pennington Lot, and the Semones Lot permitting public parking nights and weekends.

Replace all "P" signs with "Parking" signs. – This is confusing me. Seems like it should be the other way around? Can we review proposed signs before we buy them?

Remove the "bags" at the Liberty Lot "extension" and allow free parking.

Remove the "bags" on Harrison Street near Depot Court and charge using the meters.

Other Items:

Can we fix ALL of the signs in the basement of the garage showing that parking nights and weekends is allowed?

Do the words "Pennington" or "Semones" need to be on any sign? Wondering where the name adds value?

Can we change the parking garage signs to say "Public Parking" instead of "Town Garage"? Do any signs need to say "Town Garage"?

SUBJECT: Parking for Meetings at the Government Center

Please note that parking in the four-story garage next to the Loudoun County Government Center is now restricted to employees who work in the building and visitors doing business with the county.

From 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. Monday – Friday, visitors to the Government Center can only park in the visitor parking spaces on the first level of the parking garage. County employees can only park on levels 2-4 of the parking garage. Violators will be ticketed.

If all of the visitor spaces in the garage are full when you arrive for your meeting, there are several no-cost parking options near the government center ([see map](#)):

1. Pennington Lot (exit garage going west on Loudoun Street, go north on King Street, turn right onto North Street, and left onto Church Street).
2. Semones Lot (exit garage going west on Loudoun Street, go north on King Street, turn right onto North Street and continue to parking lot on the right).
3. Madison/Harrison Street Lot (exit garage going east on Loudoun Street, immediate right onto Harrison Street and lot is on the left just past the W&OD Trail).
4. Liberty Street Lot (exit garage going west on Loudoun Street, turn left onto Liberty Street which dead-ends into lot; free, public lot managed by Town of Leesburg).

Paid parking is available at the Town of Leesburg Garage and along the street at metered spaces.
