As a lifelong resident of Leesburg and Loudoun County, I write with regard to the above structures within the Leesburg Historic district. Our house, which has been my residence for the last 20 years, is in close proximity to these structures and also within the Historic district.

First, we would like to state that we support the expansion of the Courthouse. Our house was negatively affected by the construction of the Courthouse in the late 90's. We were able to resolve the issues amicably and we found the County to be respectful of our historic property.

We hope that the same respect would be afforded to the historic properties noted above. There must be a way to balance the interests of the historic district and the needs of the Courts without such direct and complete damage to historic properties. Demolition is the most extreme course of action that can be taken. It is hard to imagine that demolition of those buildings is the only alternative for the expansion of the Courthouse. The loss of these buildings will result in the loss of historic fabric. Any loss of fabric should be unacceptable unless there is evidence that every conceivable alternative has been considered.
