

# ***PROCLAMATION***

## ***BLACK HISTORY MONTH FEBRUARY 2014***

**WHEREAS**, in February of 1926, sixty-one years after the ratification of the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the United States Constitution, Dr. Carter Woodson, a noted historian, desired to recognize the achievements and contributions of Black Americans in this country; and

**WHEREAS**, the month of February was appropriately chosen to recognize the achievements of Black Americans as it contained the birth anniversaries of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass; and

**WHEREAS**, the traditional one-week observance was expanded in 1976 to include the entire month of February; and

**WHEREAS**, Black History Month allows us to honor the achievements of and celebrate the heritage of Black Americans while recalling the courage of their struggle to achieve equality; and

**WHEREAS**, historically Black Americans, such as Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Harriet Tubman, Rosa Parks, Medgar Evers, Jessie Jackson, Dred Scott, W.E.B. DuBois, and Mary McLeod Bethune have worked to lay the very foundation for the free and diverse society that we as Americans enjoy today; and

**WHEREAS**, this year marks the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing of the 1964 Civil Rights Act that gave all citizens of the United States equal rights under the law.

**THEREFORE**, the Mayor and Council of the Town of Leesburg in Virginia hereby proclaim the month of February of the Year 2014 as Black History Month in the Town of Leesburg and urge the citizens of Leesburg to join in recognizing the contributions made by the Loudoun Chapter of the NAACP and other community organizations to preserve and remember the accomplishments of Black Americans throughout the history of our nation.

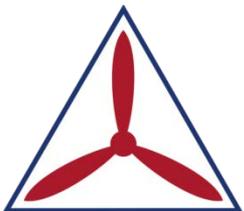



**1943: Transferred to War Department**


**1946: Incorporated (PL 476)**

# The Heritage – WWII Coastal Patrol



- CAP volunteers flew 24 million miles on anti-submarine coastal patrol for 18 months
- CAP aircrews, in armed light aircraft, reported 173 submarines, attacked 57, and sank two
- CAP summoned aid for 91 ships in distress and helped rescue 363 survivors




## Title 10, USC 9442 – Volunteer Civilian Auxiliary of the Air Force


Volunteer Civilian Auxiliary when the services of the Civil Air Patrol are used by any department or agency in any branch of the Federal Government.
